JANUARY MEETING:

We were honored to have Andrea Shetley present a program on Macro Photography. She took time from her busy schedule at Wilderness Wildlife Week in Pigeon Forge to present a program on Macro Photography to our club. She brought equipment to display and discussed various techniques of lighting and exposure and ways to resolve problems associated with this type of photography. It was a pleasure having someone of her photographic caliber but especially nice when we have such a quality individual willing to share her time with us for free.

FEBRUARY MEETING:

The February meeting will be at Roane State starting at 7:30 PM in the City Room (A111) and is a competition with the subject of "Things Aloft." If you have digital or print entries, please arrive a little early so that we can get them documented for competition. The "things" can be high like clouds, or low like bumble bees, or medium like kites, but they have to be photographed in a state unsupported by the earth. The subject matter includes, not only things stably aloft (like clouds and birds), but also things temporarily aloft, like dogs leaping for Frisbees, athletes dunking basketballs, and baseballs caught in flight as they approach the batter. Bob Epperson has agreed to judge.

Please bring prints to the meeting or send them for digital competition via e-mail to me at dfhubb@comcast.net. Remember that the files should be at a size 1450 pixels on the long side either vertical or horizontal. We can handle larger size files within the limits of e-mail; however, there is no advantage because all images are displayed at the same maximum resolution but smaller file sizes will put you at a competitive disadvantage. You may bring digital images to the club meeting; however, it is much better if you can send them in advance.

We will be awarding the 1st place winners, in both digital and prints, more Red River paper products so you may win something of value.

FUTURE COMPETITION SUBJECTS:

Please keep these competition subjects in mind as you go through your photographic day. Bob Stone, our competition chairman, has designated the theme of our April meeting as "Color as a Subject" where color is used to give a lifelike rendering of the subject. In these pictures, the color is an end in itself. An abstract work would fill the bill, or a false color photo, or maybe just a collection of unrelated but intensely colored objects. He made June "Water" pictures. These topics are different than normal for us and cover a wide enough range that everyone already may have a few entries or be motivated to look at subjects a little differently.

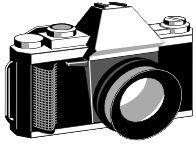

FEBRUARY MEETING. At our February meeting, Allen Eubanks, head coach for the Atomic City Rowing and club manager for the Oak Ridge Rowing Association, spoke to us about the photo opportunities provided by our local rowing events. (Our venue has been named one of the top 3 in the country!)

Over the past 15 years Bill has become one of the best-known nature photography teachers in America. His company, The Great American Photography Workshops, is one of the most successful and top-rated workshop presenters, and he has worked with a virtual Who's Who of natural history photographers. In August 2002 Bill joined Nikon as a Professional Services Representative for the national nature market and the southern United States. He is a much sought-after speaker/entertainer.

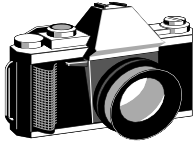

MARCH MEETING: At our March meeting, Bill Fortney spoke to the club on the subject of “How to Become a Better Digital Photographer.” An informative and enlightening topic, Bill emphasized four key points related to becoming a better photographer:

1. Always choose a definable subject that can be verbally described in one sentence.
2. Choose light that works with the subject.
3. Are the conditions right for the shot? Be prepared to adapt to the conditions you have.
4. Control the foreground and background – whatever is sharp is the subject.

In addition to the discussion, Bill presented a superb program that featured many of the best photographs in his portfolio. It was a great program and we hope to have Bill back again.

On Saturday, March 12 the club held an impromptu session to discuss “Understanding Depth of Field.” Bob Stone led the discussion and all in attendance left with a better understanding of the concept. Very Informative – thanks Bob!

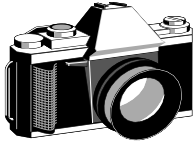

Attached are the PSA Nature Division Inter club Competition Rules for the 2011 – 2012 season. They are in an early version of Word.

For the first competition, the deadline for digital entries to me is September 15, 2011. I will not be at the September club meeting as I will be out of state between August 29, 2011 – September 14, 2011 and will not have access to my computer. I am hoping to have club entries waiting for me when I get back.

To club members: The rules for you have not changed since last year but some things have been clarified. Remember, you do not have to be a PSA member to participate. Only our club has to be a member. You can submit up to 3 e-mailed images to me and it is okay to submit resized (see rules) qualified photos from former salon or club competitions in addition to anything new you might want to submit to me. We have to have a minimum of 4 club members participating and submit 6 total images to PSA in order to be competitive as a club. I will contact

all participants to let them know which entries were selected to go to PSA and what scores/points were received once the PSA judging is completed. Last year our club finished a little better than in the middle of the pack for the two competitions in which we participated. Not bad for our first season but let's try to better our finish this year.

PSA Nature Division Interclub Competition

Seven club members participated in the first PSA Nature Division Interclub Competition of the 2011 – 2012 season. Six photos submitted by Ann Ford, Alice Reed, Bob McAnally, James Ford (2) and Carol Slay were selected to represent the Camera Club of Oak Ridge. The selected entries will be judged and points will be awarded to the individual photos. Results will be reported when they are received.

We are in Class B. Individual blue “AWARD” ribbons will be awarded by PSA for the five highest individual scores in each class of each contest. Ties will be broken if more than 5 images have the highest score. Approximately 10% of the individuals will be awarded with red “HONOR” ribbons.

First, second and third place ribbons will be presented to the clubs in each class based on the total points for the six images in each

of the three contests. First, second and third place awards will be presented to the clubs in each class at the end of the season based on the total accumulated points for the three contests.

The judge for this first contest will be the Carolinas Nature Photographers, a club in Class A. Class A clubs judge Class B clubs and vice versa. At the end of this season, the two Class B Clubs with the highest season total for all three contests will be moved up to Class A for the following season's competition. The two Class A Clubs with the lowest season total for all three contests will be moved down to Class B for the following season's competition.

Last season, our first, we participated in only two of three PSA Nature Division Interclub competitions. We finished in the middle of the pack for each of those two contests and had no individual winners or honorable mentions.

The call for photos for the second contest of this season will go out in November. All entries are digital. You don't have to be a PSA member to participate.

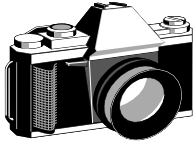
