- **June 2020 meeting:** The June 2020 meeting on **Tuesday, June 9th**, will be a photo competition dedicated to the topic of **"Glass Architecture"**. In architecture, glass can be used as external walls, internal partitions and a myriad of other features. Due to its reflective nature, it will be important for you to use the right settings when trying to photograph it, and aim to shoot in a softer, less harsh, light. You may be able to harness glass' reflectivity to your advantage and know that in this competition you can choose to either have or not have reflections in the glass. The creative decision is yours!

Options include zooming in or going macro, creating patterns by capturing motion blur, or using post-processing to create an interesting image. Doing video conferencing via Zoom has become very popular these days and we at the camera club decided to use this software too. We are volunteers trying something new in an unprecedented time. 1) Update to Zoom 5.0 is now required!

Zoom is updating their software, with more advanced security. You will need to update your zoom app to version 5.0 or later in order to use it as of May 30; after that the old versions will not work. **You will need to update your app in order to join our June meeting.** Let me know if you need guidance on how to update.

2) **Note:** The zoom meeting ID will NOT be posted. To avoid 'zoom-bombing' you will receive the Meeting ID AND the password by email. Please do not post the meeting ID anywhere.
